Definition of a PEI Resident

As per the Provincial Student Loan program, a student is considered a resident of PEI if the student (as an independent or married/common-law student) or the student's family (as a dependent student) has most recently maintained a family home in PEI for at least 12 consecutive months prior to beginning the student's post-secondary education. This applies even if a parent works in another province / territory. Or, a student can establish residency in PEI based on their spouse's employment while they were married and chose to remain here to study after the relationship ended. (Please note – full-time students do not earn residency status while they are attending a PEI post-secondary institution.)
