# 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 To state the rates provided to eligible applicants for the cost of childcare services for families with children up to and including 12 years olds.

# 2.0 **DEFINITIONS**

- 2.1 **Applicant:** a person who applies for, on whose behalf an application is made, or is in receipt of childcare subsidy.
- 2.2 **Child Care Subsidy Coordinator:** a staff member responsible to provide intake assessment and service for CCSP.
- 2.3 **Co-applicant:** the spouse of an applicant, and includes a person who, although not married to the applicant, lives with the applicant as if they were married.
- 2.4 **Licenced Childcare Centre**: a licensed centre where the operator is authorized to provide childcare services to infants, preschool children, and school-age children.
- 2.5 **Market Basket Measure (MBM):** is a measure of low income based on the cost of a specific basket of goods and services representing a modest, basic standard of living. The MBM is determined by Statistics Canada.

#### 3.0 POLICY STATEMENT

- 3.1 The Department will pay the per diem rates for childcare according to the *Childcare Rates Schedule* (attached), less any parent share to be paid by the applicant.
- 3.2 Where the actual cost of childcare is greater than the allowable per diem rates, the applicant is responsible for the additional costs.
- 3.3 Applicants are responsible to pay any fees charged by a licenced childcare centre relating to:

- Registration and administration fees;
- Deposits;
- Penalties for late pick-up;
- Late payment fees.
- 3.4 Changes in per diem rates due to a change in the child's age will take effect on the child's birthday.

# 4.0 PROCEDURAL STATEMENTS

- 4.1 The Child Care Subsidy Coordinator will refer to the *Childcare Rates Schedule* (attached) to determine the eligible costs for childcare of the applicant based on the childcare arrangements, the number of hours of childcare required per day, and the age of the child.
- 4.2 Payments for a child attending a licenced childcare facility are paid directly to the Child Care Centre.
- 4.3 Payments for a child attending a private childcare provider are paid to a parent. Payment to a private childcare provider is the responsibility of the applicant.
- 4.4 Where a child attends a licenced childcare facility, the Child Care Centre will complete and submit the *Child Care Subsidy Attendance and Billing Record* to the Child Care Subsidy Coordinator for review and payment on a monthly basis.
- 4.5 Where an applicant utilizes a private childcare provider, the applicant is responsible to submit childcare receipts to the Child Care Subsidy Coordinator for review and payment on a monthly basis.

# **Childcare Rates Schedule**

Child Care Centres (Full Day Programs)	<b>Per Diem Rates</b>
Infants (Birth – 2 years)	\$34
2 year olds	\$28
3-4 year olds	\$27
School Age Child Care (up to the age of 12)	
Full Day Rate (storm days, holidays, professional development days, etc.)	\$30
Before and After School	\$15

Private Child Care Provider	<b>Infant Rate</b>	2 years old and above
1 child -full day(>/= 4 hours)	\$30 per child	\$25 per child
1 child-½ day(< 4 hours)	\$15 per child	\$13 per child
