HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT DEMERIT POINT SYSTEM REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to section 284 of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Item 13 of the Schedule to the *Highway Traffic Act* Demerit Point System Regulations (EC1216/80) is amended
 - (a) by the deletion of the word "5" in Column 2 and the substitution of the word "8"; and

(b) by the deletion of the words "Failing to stop for a school bus receiving or discharging school children" in Column 3 and the substitution of the words "Failing to stop for a school bus when the flashing red lights are displayed on the school bus".

2. These regulations come into force on January 25, 2003.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The amendment increases the number of demerit points from 5 to 8 for drivers who are convicted of failing to stop for a school bus when it is displaying flashing red lights.

PROVINCIALLY OWNED LAND
AT NORTH LAKE, KINGS COUNTY
EXEMPTION FROM
IDENTIFICATION FOR NON-DEVELOPMENT USE

Pursuant to section 21 of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5 Council determined that, upon transfer of administration and control to Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada, land and land covered by water located at North Lake in Lot 47, Kings County, Prince Edward Island, totalling approximately one decimal zero four (1.04) acres but having in excess of one hundred and sixty five (165) feet of shore frontage, and currently owned by the Government of Prince Edward Island, as represented by the Minister of Transportation and Public Works, NOT be identified for non-development use under the Land Identification Program established by the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95).
