### CRIMINAL CODE OF CANADA TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES FOR THE CONDUCT AND MANAGEMENT OF LOTTERY SCHEMES

#### AMENDMENT LOTTERY SCHEMES ORDER

Pursuant to section 207 of the Criminal Code of Canada, R.S.C. 1985, Chap. C.-46, Council made the following order:

### 1. The Criminal Code of Canada Lottery Schemes Order (EC884/84) is amended by the addition of the following after section 4.3:

#### **4.4** (1) In this section

Definitions

- (a) "satellite bingo licensee" means the holder of a license issued satellite bingo under subsection (2);
- (b) "participating licensee" means an organization that holds a participating license to operate a bingo and that has agreed to participate in a satellite bingo game operated by the satellite bingo licensee.

(2) The Minister is authorized to issue a license to PEI (Satellite) PEI (Satellite) Bingo Association Inc. to conduct and operate satellite bingo games on Bingo Association behalf of participating licensees.

(3) Sections 4.1 to 4.3 of this Order and sections 8 and 18 of the Application of Schedule to this Order do not apply to bingos conducted and operated by provisions of Order the satellite bingo licensee.

(4) The following prize limits are established for bingos conducted and Prize limits operated by the satellite bingo licensee:

- (a) maximum aggregate prizes in any period of 24 hours shall not exceed \$40,000;
- (b) the maximum prize for any one game shall be \$40,000;
- (c) accumulating or build-up jackpots shall not exceed \$40,000;
- (d) the total guaranteed prizes, excluding accumulating or build-up jackpots, at any bingo event shall not exceed \$1,000 plus \$100 for each participating licensee.
- (5) Where the satellite bingo licensee engages a third party service Restriction on provider to operate a satellite bingo system, the service provider is not service charges entitled to charge for services rendered in excess of 20% of gross receipts (plus applicable taxes) in any calendar month.

(6) It is a term and condition of any license issued under subsection (2) Prohibition that no person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age shall play in a satellite bingo game or be awarded a satellite bingo game prize.

# 2. This order comes into force on September 17, 2005.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

This amendment adds a provision to the Lottery Schemes Order to authorize the issuance of a license to PEI (Satellite) Bingo Association Inc. to operate satellite bingos. It establishes prize limits, service charge limits and age limits for satellite bingo games.

Every clergyman, minister or other person authorized by the law of the Province to solemnized marriages shall, at the time of each marriage make a written record thereof in the form prescribed and every such record shall be signed by each of the parties to the marriage and by the minister, clergyman or other person authorized as aforesaid officiating and by at least two credible witnesses.

Every clergyman, minister or other person authorized as aforesaid shall, within forty-eight hours from and after the solemnization by him or her of a marriage, deliver or forward by letter to the Registrar General a complete record thereof according to the prescribed form.

DIRECTOR OF VITAL STATISTICS

These amendments replace the words bride and groom with the word spouses and update several forms set out in the regulations to recognize and facilitate the marriages of same-gender couples.

# WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT ANGLING REGULATIONS **AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 28 of the Wildlife Conservation Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. W-4.1, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Section 1 of the Schedule LICENSE FEES, of the Wildlife Conservation Act Angling Regulations (EC180/02) is amended
  - (a) by the revocation of subclause (v); and
  - (b) by renumbering subclause (vi) as subclause (v).
- 2. Section 3 of the Schedule is revoked.
- 3. These regulations come into force on August 27, 2005.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The amendment removes a fee exempted for farmers and commercial fishers. Farmers and commercial fishers, when purchasing an angling license, are now required to pay the prescribed fee.

# WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT WILDLIFE CONSERVATION FUND REGULATIONS **AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 28 of the Wildlife Conservation Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. W-4.1, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Subsection 1(2) of the Wildlife Conservation Act Wildlife Conservation Fund Regulations (EC211/99) is revoked and the following substituted:
- (2) Every person who obtains a license or a permit for angling, hunting Fee or trapping pursuant to the Wildlife Conservation Act or any regulations made or continued under the Act, shall pay a Wildlife Conservation Fund
  - (a) in the amount of \$12.15 where the person is 65 years of age or older; or
  - (b) in the amount of \$18.69 where the person is between 16 and 65 years of age.
- 2. These regulations come into force on August 27, 2005.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The amendment increases the Wildlife Conservation Fund fee from \$12.15 to \$18.69 for persons between 16 and 65 years of age.

# WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to section 28 of the *Wildlife Conservation Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. W-4.1, Council made the following regulations:

1. Schedule IV of the *Fish and Game Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-12 General Regulations (EC818/66) is amended by the revocation of subclause 4(iii) and the substitution of the following:

(iii) Youth Hunting License ...... fre

2. These regulations come into force on August 27, 2005.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The amendment revokes a reference to a Commercial Fishers/Farmers hunting license as set out in Schedule IV of the *Fish and Game Protection Act* General Regulations. The amendment also includes provision for the issuance of a Youth Hunting License free of charge.
