 - (a) by renumbering section 1 as section 1.1; and
 - (b) by the addition of the following before section 1.1:
- 1. In these regulations, "Act" means the Wildlife Conservation Act Act, defined R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. W-4.1.
- 3. Section 1.1 of the regulations is amended by the addition of the following after subsection (5):
 - (6) No person shall
 - (a) hunt with a firearm;
 - (b) obtain or attempt to obtain a license to hunt; or (c) possess a license to hunt,

where there is a prohibition in place relating to the possession or use of a firearm by the person.

- 4. The regulations are amended by the addition of the following after section 5:
- 6. Where any person is convicted of an offence pursuant to clauses Automatic 19(1)(c), (f), (g), (i) or (n) of the Act, and the person used property in forfeiture respect of the commission of the offence, the property shall be seized by a conservation officer and be automatically forfeited to Her Majesty in right of the province upon conviction.

firearm

5. These regulations come into force on November 11, 2006.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The amendment defines the Act. A prohibition is added against hunting with a firearm or obtaining, attempting to obtain or possessing a license to hunt by a person in circumstances where the person is prohibited from possessing or using a firearm. The amendment outlines offence provisions in the Act that result, upon conviction, in automatic forfeiture of seized property.
