ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT INSPECTION FEE REGULATIONS

Pursuant to section 25 of the Environmental Protection Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-9, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. A fee of \$50 per lot is payable for the inspection of a lot by an Fees environment officer, for the purposes of
 - (a) determining the drinking quality of the water on the lot;
 - (b) identifying sensitive environmental issues on the lot;
 - (c) establishing the necessary buffer zone requirements for the lot;
 - (d) conducting an environmental site inspection of the lot;
 - (e) reviewing an application for the subdivision of the lot into more than two parcels of land or an application for the subdivision of the lot where known environmentally sensitive features exist, such as a watercourse, a wetland or a sand dune.
- 2. An application for a property inspection is set out in the Schedule to Schedule these regulations.
- 3. These regulations come into force on October 10, 2009.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends the offence provision in the regulations. The prohibition against setting a trap within 3 metres (10 feet) of the house or den of a beaver is removed.

SECTION 2 amends the Schedule to reflect the most recent trap certification list pertaining to the list of approved body-gripping traps approved for use as killing traps for beaver, muskrat and raccoon in the province.

2. These regulations come into force on October 10, 2009.

There will be no open season for Hungarian (Grey) Partridge in Lots 1-10 inclusive, and in Lots 43-47 inclusive, in 2009/2010.

^{**} Hunting with hounds is permitted from October 1 – February 27. The running of hounds for training or for any other purpose will not be permitted from March 1 through September 30, except by permit.

^{***} A Snowshoe Hare Snaring License is required to snare snowshoe hare.

During the months of February and March, trap sets for beaver, muskrat and mink are restricted to those set in or over water. Weasel traps are restricted to Victor rat traps.

^{**} A "modified foothold trap" is a foothold trap that has been altered to improve the humaneness of the trap by laminating the jaws, off-setting the jaws or padding the jaws.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends the Schedules to the regulations that outline hunting seasons and limits and trapping seasons for game and furbearing animals in the province.

SECTION 2 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
