OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE ACT

REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to clause 12(2)(c) and section 22 of the *Off-Highway Vehicle Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. O-3, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. The enactment clause of the *Off-Highway Vehicle Act* Regulations (EC96/88) is amended by the addition of the words "clause 12(2)(c) and" after the words "Pursuant to".
- 2. The regulations are amended by the addition of the following after section 11:
- ${\bf 11.1}\,(1)\,{\rm A}$ snowmobile may be operated on a closed seasonal or closed scenic heritage highway.
- (2) No person shall operate a snowmobile on a closed seasonal or closed scenic heritage highway unless the person holds a valid driver's license, of any class, issued under the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5.
- 3. Section 20 of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words "8 kilometers per hour within 30 meters" and the substitution of the words "40 kilometres per hour within 30 metres".
- 4. These regulations come into force on February 4, 2017.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends the enactment clause of the regulations to reference the provision in the Act that is the authority for the amendment being made in section 2 of these regulations.

SECTION 2 adds a section to the regulations to authorize licensed drivers to operate snow vehicles on closed seasonal and closed scenic heritage highways. Seasonal and scenic heritage highways are deemed, by the *Roads Act*, to be closed during the winter months of November through April, which means they are not maintained.

SECTION 3 increases the maximum speed permitted when driving an off-highway vehicle within 30 metres of a dwelling or place where a person is taking shelter or practising an outdoor sport, and corrects the misspelled words "kilometers" and "meters".

SECTION 4 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
