Pursuant to subsection 24(2) of the *Fire Prevention Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-11, and upon the recommendation of the Minister of Justice and Public Safety and Attorney General, Council made the following Order:

- 1. Section 1 of the *Fire Prevention Act* Codes and Standards Order (EC16/85) is amended by the addition of the following after clause (a.1):
 - (a.2) 2015 Edition of the National Research Council's National Fire Code;
- 2. Section 2 of the Order is amended by the deletion of the words "Uniform Fire Code or Life Safety Code" wherever they occur and the substitution of the words "Uniform Fire Code, Life Safety Code or National Fire Code".
- 3. This Order comes into force on April 25, 2020.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 adds clause 1(a.2) to the *Fire Prevention Act* Codes and Standards Order to add the National Fire Code of the National Research Council, 2015 Edition, to the list of Codes and Standards that are in force in the province.

SECTION 2 amends section 2 of the Codes and Standards Order to include the National Fire Code in the Codes listed in that section.

SECTION 3 provides for the commencement of the Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends the *Summary Proceedings Act* Ticket Regulations (EC58/08) to add new Parts 8.01 and 8.02. Part 8.01 specifies the offences under the *Building Codes Act* that may be enforced by means of a ticket, and the penalties for those offences. Part 8.02 specifies the offences under the Building Codes Regulations that may be enforced by means of a ticket, and the penalties for those offences.

SECTION 2 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
