EDUCATION ACT SCHOOL CALENDAR REGULATIONS **AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 107 of the Education Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-.02, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Section 2 of the Education Act School Calendar Regulations (EC530/16) is revoked and the following substituted:
- 2. (1) The Minister shall ensure that there are at least 195, but not more Total school days than 197, school days in each school year.
- (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the Minister shall ensure that there Exception, 2021are at least 194, but not more than 197, school days in the school year 2022 commencing in 2021 and ending in 2022, to provide for the first observance of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30, 2021.

- 2. Section 8 of the regulations is amended by the addition of the following after clause (f):
 - (f.1) National Day for Truth and Reconciliation;
- 3. These regulations come into force on September 25, 2021.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 revokes and replaces section 2 to allow one less school day in the 2021-2022 school year to provide for the first observance of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30, 2021.

SECTION 2 amends section 8 of the regulations to add the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation to the list of holidays that are not instructional days or school days.

SECTION 3 provides for the commencement of these regulations.

ROADS ACT HIGHWAY ACCESS REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to subsection 29(1) of the *Roads Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-15, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Clause 1(3)(e) of Schedule A-3, INFILLING AREAS, of the *Roads Act* Highway Access Regulations (EC580/95) is revoked and the following substituted:
 - (e) in the Community of Hunter River, that segment of highway that lies between the lot line separating Lot 22 and Lot 23 and a line created between the eastern boundaries of property numbers 284729 and 284828, as they existed on August 5, 2021;
- 2. These regulations come into force on September 25, 2021.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 revises the eastern limits of the Arterial Infilling section of Rte 2 in Hunter River formerly set at the intersection of Route 13 to a point set approximately 295 meters east of the intersection. This location is within the 50 km/h speed zone defined by signage and a central splitter island. This change will allow for development (change of use) of several properties abutting this section of highway.
