Temporary Adjuster Licensing – Damage from Storm Fiona

This Bulletin is to advise all insurers and adjusting firms operating in Prince Edward Island of a decision to extend temporary adjuster licenses for those approved to date. These licenses were specifically approved to address the high volume of claims resulting from the storm Fiona.

Due to the extensive damage and ongoing work still required, our Office has determined it is necessary to extend the temporary adjuster license term to 120 days. The 120 day period starts from the initial approval date for each temporary adjuster approved.

For those who have already received temporary licensing under this program, there is no need to submit further documentation or contact our office as the extension will happen automatically.

Please also note Prince Edward Island will cease to accept temporary adjuster licenses for Fiona related damage effective November 22, 2022.
