Financial and Consumer Services Division Registry and Licensing Services Insurance Update Automobile Insurance Minor Injury Cap – Annual Indexation 2024

This bulletin is to provide the annual indexation of the Automobile Insurance Minor Injury Cap for the 2024 calendar year as required by Section 254.2(4) of the *Insurance Act*.

Annual average change in the Consumer Price Index for PEI for 2023*: **2.9%** *all-items, not seasonally adjusted

Background

On April 1, 2004, the province amended the *Insurance Act* to limit non-pecuniary damages (*ie. pain and suffering*) for minor personal injuries occurring as a result of an automobile accident to \$2,500. The definition of a minor personal injury and the cap amount was subsequently amended to \$7,500 for accidents occurring on or after October 1, 2014. On January 1, 2016, and January 1 of each subsequent calendar year, the maximum amount recoverable as damages for that calendar year is set by adjusting the immediately preceding calendar year's maximum amount recoverable as damages by the annual average percentage change for the all-items Consumer Price Index for Prince Edward Island, not seasonally adjusted, published by Statistics Canada, for the immediately preceding calendar year.
