Cross-curricular - Week 1




This week, your job is to become an explorer!

With your parent/guardian or older sibling, go outside and find all the clues that spring is here. Use the chart in your package to record your findings. You will need to use your senses to discover the clues.

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Draw a map of where you found your clues. You can use the body symbols from your chart to show what senses you used to find the signs of spring. For example, if you saw and heard a robin, then you can draw the robin and put an eye and an ear next to it.

We need to use our senses to discover the world around us. Now it is time to create a sensory box!

- Decorate a bag or small box. Go outside (with a parent/guardian or older sibling) to collect different things from nature (for example, a flower, leaf, twig, grass, etc.).
- Using the graph in your package, draw a picture of each item in your bag (make sure not to let anyone see this yet!). Ask each family member to put their hand in the bag and try to guess what each item is without looking at it. Everytime they get one right, put a checkmark next to that picture on your chart.

What object had the most correct guesses? What object had the least correct guesses?

• Now it's your turn to feel the items in your bag. Reach in and feel one item. In a journal or on a piece of paper, describe what the item feels like. Include as many details as you can. Is it smooth, rough, sharp, soft, hard, etc.? What does the texture remind you of?
