Eligible expenses:

IVF/IUI treatment provided at a fertility clinic in Canada.

Non-eligible expenses:

- Expenses associated with IVF/IUI treatment that occurred prior to approval for a 12-month term;
- Storage of eggs/sperm;
- Travel, accommodations, and food;
- · Initial consultation fee at the clinic; and
- Any testing or procedure that is available on PEI and is covered by Provincial Medicare.

Fertility Treatment Program





PEI's Fertility Treatment Program provides funding support for up to a maximum of three 12-month terms to eligible PEI residents who access in-vitro fertilization (IVF) treatment, or intrauterine insemination (IUI) treatment provided at fertility clinics in Canada.

Application Process

To access funding for fertility treatment, you must complete and submit an application to the Fertility Treatment Program office. If eligible, you will receive a letter confirming the funding amount and the 12-month period you are approved for.

Only eligible expenses that occur during the approved period will be considered for reimbursement.

Eligibility

To be considered eligible for the program, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a permanent PEI resident as defined by the Health and Dental Services Cost Assistance Act;
- · Have a valid PEI Health Card; and
- Have filed your most recent income tax return.

Funding

The funding amount for eligible expenses associated with IVF/IUI treatment is based on family income and ranges between \$5,000 and \$10,000 per 12-month term.

Annual Family Income	Maximum Funding
under \$50,000	\$10,000
\$50,001 and \$100,00	\$7,500
over \$100,001	\$5,000

Private Insurance

If the eligible person has or is covered by private insurance and is approved to receive funding under the Fertility Treatment
Program, they are required to submit a letter from the insurance company confirming the terms of coverage for any expenses related to IVF/IUI treatment prior to submitting reimbursement claim(s) to the Fertility
Treatment Program office.

Where private insurance coverage for IVF/IUI treatment exists, the insurance company is a first payor. This means that all receipts must be submitted to the private insurance company first. Expenses not covered by the private insurance can be submitted to the Fertility Treatment Program office.
