- There will be no testing on the activities provided here.
- Consider completing a variety of literacy, numeracy, health and well-being activities during the week.

Literacy

Oral language communication in French:

20 min./day

- ✓ Via Facetime or another app, share with classmates favorite books that you've read, activities over the March break, opinions and feelings.
- ✓ Try phone conversations with classmates in French.
- ✓ View French movies or music on Youtube (age appropriate). Suggest a classmate watch the same movie or music to discuss afterward.
- ✓ Prepare a promotional video for a movie to share with classmates or teacher.

- Have older children create simple strategy/board games for younger siblings

✓ Online Websites/Apps

- o Practice math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division)
- Practice more complex concepts (fractions, measurement, estimation, area/perimeter/volume, etc)

✓ Cooking

 Follow a recipe to work on fractions and precise measurement (Option to double a recipe)

✓ Data Analysis

 Make simple graphs representing data over time (weekly gas prices, daily temperature, etc)
