September 2023

GEORGIA – TAX FREE PERIOD Q3-2023

The State of Georgia has announced that they will have a temporary suspension of the tax on motor fuel sales beginning on September 13, 2023 and extending through the end of the IFTA third quarter.

If you have travel in Georgia between September 13, 2023 and September 30, 2023, please use the instructions below for filling out the GA jurisdictional row on your Q3-2023 IFTA return.

1. Enter the total kilometers travelled in Georgia for the entire third quarter in Column 3 (Total Kms).
2. Subtract the kilometers travelled in Georgia between September 13, 2023 and September 30, 2023 from the total kilometers travelled in Georgia (Column 3) and enter this value in Column 4 (Total Taxable Kms).
3. Enter the total litres of fuel purchased in Georgia for the entire third quarter in Column 6 (Total Litres Purchased).
4. Subtract the number of litres of fuel purchased in Georgia between September 13, 2023 and September 30, 2023 from the total litres purchased in Georgia (Column 6) and enter this value in Column 7 (Tax Paid Litres Purchased).

Complete the remainder of the Georgia (GA) jurisdictional line as normal.
