# PEI-Québec Exchange Program

### Description

A PEI student is matched with a francophone QC student. Each student spends 3 months in the other's family. The objectives of the program include improving French language skills and promoting awareness of other education systems and cultures. The department of Education Early Learning and Culture offers a credit for the exchange, FRE521G, when all of the program requirements are successfully met in their entirety.

## Program clientele

The student exchange program is offered to public school students who are in Grade 11. Applications must be submitted during the Grade 10 year, the year prior to the exchange.

#### **Conditions**

The student and their guardians must accept all conditions outlined in the application form. They agree to treat the QC student as a part of their family for 3 months, equal to their own child. Students must have approval from their school to participate. Formal compliance with all conditions is indicated by signatures on the application.

#### Cost

There is no fee to participate in this program. If accepted, there is a required deposit of \$200. The deposit is refundable in full upon successful completion of the program in its entirety as outlined in the Participant Guide. A student who does not fulfill all the requirements of the program, including successful completion of FRE521G may not have their deposit returned. This deposit is payable by cheque, paid to the "Minister of Finance". The PEI Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture and culture covers the cost of flights to and from the destination in Québec. A chaperone is also provided for both the departure and return trips. While hosting the Québec student, the PEI host family is responsible to house and feed the QC student and to pay for any family activities they provide for their own child. Personal expenses are the responsibility of the student. While in Québec, the host family reciprocates; the PEI student is in the care of the host family, who provides according to the same specifications. The PEI student should have funds to cover additional personal expenses (ex: baggage fees, etc.). A student who returns home before the end of the exchange does so at the expense of their family, except for extenuating circumstances.

#### Selection Criteria

Applications are evaluated by the program coordinator in consultation with department representatives. Accepted applications are sent to Éducation Internationale to be matched. Even once an application is accepted at the provincial level, there is no guarantee a suitable twin can be found in Québec. Applications are evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Full endorsement of student participation by guardians and school officials
- Level of interest or hesitation demonstrated by student, family and school officials
- Ease of adapting to new and challenging situations
- Intention of completing the program in its entirety, despite challenges
- Sense of humour
- Level of maturity
- Satisfactory criminal record checks for all adults living in the home

- Openness and lack of prejudice
- Health, ability to meet requirements
- Ability to accommodate another adolescent in the home for 3 months.
- Acceptance by host family of twin proposed by program officials
- Respect for communication policy (p. 13)
- Ability to adhere to conditions
- Level of responsibility demonstrated by student to manage exchange
- Ability to meet mandatory criteria (ex: satisfactory criminal record check).

#### Definition of terms

In this application...

- -The "host period" refers to the 3 months during which the Québec student will be residing with the PEI family.
- -The term "home" refers to any residence(s) at which the student will be residing during the hosting period of the exchange.
- -The "twin" refers to the exchange students. "PEI twin" refers to the PEI student participating in the exchange. "Québec twin" refers to the Québec student participating in the exchange, with whom the PEI student and their family have been matched.

## About Éducation Internationale:

Founded in 2001, Éducation internationale is a not-for-profit cooperative which offers exchange and development services in education. When they founded the cooperative, Quebec school boards and its associated organisations created a single window to open up the Quebec schooling system to the international scene and to assist students in becoming citizens of the world.

Submission of this application is not a guarantee or participation or that a twin can be found, but indicates a willingness to participate fully in the program and the intention to see it through until the end. I/We understand that even if the application is accepted and is officially submitted by the Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture to the program administrator, Éducation Internationale, participation will not be confirmed until the student has been matched and all the parties concerned have given their consent in this regard.

The student and parents/guardians must all show interest in the program. It is important that the application be submitted with the intention of completing both portions of the exchange in their entirety. Once a twinning is made, a withdrawal will carry serious consequences for the partner in Québec. He/she/they may not be able to participate at all as a result of your decision if another twin cannot be found.

Parents/guardians must encourage their child to persevere in the exchange, once a commitment has been made. In case of fear, loneliness or other difficulties adapting, we encourage parents to talk with students and with the program coordinator in an attempt to work through any difficulties and promote a successful exchange. Only in extenuating circumstances should termination or the exchange be considered.

By signing below, I/we indicate that we understand the application process, the conditions outline above, and my/our commitment. I/We agree to proceed in the application and subsequent evaluation and selection processes. I/We am/are aware that there may be risks associated with participation, as with any program and I/we accept any and all risks, and I/we fully endorse my/our child's participation. I/We have reviewed and discussed the entire application with my/our child, and I/we affirm that my/our child (the applicant) understands their role and agrees to uphold their responsibilities.

#### COMMUNICATION

The PEI-Québec exchange program has a limited number of spaces available. Students are selected based on detailed criteria outlined at the beginning of this application form and are paired based on the availability of a suitable match in Québec. The program can highly competitive depending on interest in a given year in both provinces. In order for the exchange to run smoothly and to be a pleasant experience for all parties involved, both the student and their parents must agree to engage in prompt, effective communication. The success of the exchange is contingent on this condition. If removed from the program due to non-compliance, the registration fee will not be refunded.

The desired effective communication is defined as follows:

- o Agreement to receive communications via email. The <u>student</u> and at least <u>1 guardian</u> must provide an email address, which they check regularly (once daily). Email is the primary method of document delivery. Students and guardians commit to read all communications and respond as necessary. Failure to attentively read all information received may result in missed deadlines or non-compliance, and can result in immediate removal from the program.
- o Agreement to respond to email communications. Many emails you receive will not require a response. When a response is required, it will be stated clearly. Desired information will be clearly identified. A response is expected within a reasonable time frame (48 hours). If a response is not possible, a phone call must be made to the program coordinator to discuss the matter. Failure to respond to communications as requested by the program coordinator may result in removal from the program.
- o Agreement to adhere to deadlines. This program is coordinated on PEI by the Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture, but it is run by an exterior entity in Québec known as Éducation Internationale. The PEI program coordinator has a role to play as a part of this exchange and requires your cooperation in the timely submission of accurate information in order to fulfill the province's commitment as a host province and as partners in the exchange program. Failure to adhere to deadlines will result in removal from the program.
- o Agreement to attend the orientation session. There is only 1 meeting required for participating students and 1 guardian. With the exception of extenuating circumstances, participants and 1 guardian must attend this meeting. Ample notice is given for the meeting (the date is set 2-3 months in advance). When the date is sent out via email, families have 48 hours to indicate a scheduling conflict due to a pre-established commitment. If no response is given from the family, attendance is expected. Failure to attend will result in removal from the program, except for extenuating circumstances.

For your child to be matched with a student from Québec, the information will also be disclosed to the persons responsible for or involved in the administration of the program (schools, school board personnel, etc.) and then to the parents of the host family.

Participation in the exchange programs is optional, as is the disclosure of the information requested for the implementation of those programs. However, refusing to provide certain information could result in the rejection of the application. Please note that, under the *Act respecting access to documents held by public bodies and the protection of personal information*, any information held by a public body (or on behalf of a public body by its mandatary) may be consulted and possibly corrected by the person concerned. If necessary, you may address such a request to the Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture.

- o I accept that I may not drive a motor vehicle during my stay in Québec.
- o I formally undertake to behave in a manner that is respectful of all the parties involved in the exchange and to avoid damaging anyone's reputation.
- o I am aware that exchange students are asked to refrain from engaging in any sexual relationships during the program.
- o I undertake to limit contacts with my family and friends during my exchange, because I am aware that excessive contact will slow down the immersion process and hinder my adjustment to the new culture.
- o I am aware that I am prohibited from taking trips during my stay with my host family without the consent of my parents and my host family and that I am not allowed to travel alone.
- o I undertake to help my host family with household chores.
- o I undertake to follow the host family's rules, even if they are different from my family's.
- o I agree that I am not allowed to be visited by friends and boyfriends/girlfriends during my exchange program stay.
- o I am aware that downloading material from the internet (films, music, etc.), without complying with copyright and making appropriate payment is illegal. I therefore agree to ask my host family for permission before downloading any material from the internet.
- o I understand that I am not permitted to disclose private information about, or photographs of, my host family on social media, such as Facebook, without their prior consent.
- o I undertake to follow the rules of my host school and to focus primarily on the work that it asks me to do.
- o I agree that I am not permitted to miss any classes without a valid reason approved by the host guardians or school personnel.
- o I formally undertake to follow the instructions given by the teachers responsible for the exchange program at my host school.\*
- o I undertake to welcome my host partner in an English-speaking environment.
- o I undertake to make my partner my priority when I welcome him/her to my home, for example, by prioritizing my partner over my job and recreational activities.
- o I undertake to prepare for my absence from school but also to attend remedial classes upon my return and to make every effort required to ensure that I catch up on my school work.
- o I will not withdraw from the program unless extenuating circumstances prevail and full consultation with my partner, school, host family, and PEI Program Coordinator has taken place in an effort to resolve the issue(s).
- o I understand that should I default on any of the above, the exchange may be terminated and any additional costs incurred will be my mine/my parents'/guardians' expense.

# UNDERTAKING AND CONSENT FORM FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- o I/We declare that I/we have read the exchange program participant guide in its entirety and that I/we are satisfied with the information provided.
- o After having received and understood the information in the participant guide concerning this Program, I/we agree to the program conditions, and I/we consent to having this registration application processed by staff members designated by the participating educational institutions.
- o I/We consent to participating in an in-home interview with these staff members to process the application.
- o I/We approve participation in the exchange and will endeavor to make the experience as successful as possible.
- o I/We understanding that if our child is accepted into the program, it is our responsibility to contact Health PEI to advise them of our child's 3-month stay in the province of Québec.
- o I/We agree to allow the host family to act as the guardian of my/our child while he/she/they is/are under their authority during a student exchange program. This authorization applies to medical care in emergency situations. For all non-emergency medical care, an attempt should be made to contact parents before seeking medical care. This provisional authorization expires at the end of the exchange.
- o I/We understand that, in the event of a serious breach of the code of conduct by our child, he/she/they could be sent home, at our expense. I/we understand that illegal or disruptive behavior, including but not limited to the use of drugs, alcohol or other intoxicating substances is sufficient reason for termination of the exchange by the PEI Department of Education, Early Learning and Culture or by Éducation Internationale at their discretion.
- o I/We undertake to support our child during the integration process and to minimize contacts with him/her/them.
- o I/We are aware that we are strongly advised against visiting our child in Quebec.
- o I/We undertake to inform the person responsible for the student exchange program at the school (liaison teacher) and the program coordinator of any major difficulty experienced by our child during the program.
- o I/We undertake to inform the program coordinator of any change in our family situation (separation, divorce, move, etc.). I/We are aware that, if there is a change the application may not be accepted. I/We understand that the family of the Québec twin with whom our child is matched may also decline to accept the match.
- o I/We declare that I/we will accommodate the Québec twin into our home and provide him/her/them with reasonable care and supervision during the exchange period. I/We undertake to suggest activities that will enable him/her/them to discover the culture of our province. I/We undertake to provide the foreign student with an English-speaking family context.
- o I/We confirm that 1 guardian will be present when the Québec twin arrives and leaves.
- o I/We undertake to cover the living expenses of the student we host, including school lunches, transportation to and from school, and any organized family activities where I/we will be covering the cost for my/our own child.

- o I/We undertake to notify the program coordinator if our child has to come home early.
