
### **Prince Edward Island**

Prince Edward Island (PEI) is the smallest province in Canada, representing less than 0.1% of the country's land area<sup>1</sup>. The Island has a total land area of 1.4 million acres. Farmland represents about 36.04% of the province's total land area (504,674 acres)<sup>2</sup>. In October 2024, the population of PEI was reported to be 179,301<sup>3</sup>. PEI's economy is largely resource-based. The agriculture and agri-food sector is important for PEI's economy and contributed 40.41% to total PEI exports. Primary agriculture in PEI is comprised of crops and livestock, namely: potatoes, fruits, horticulture, grains, dairy, beef, and hogs<sup>4</sup>.

# **PEI Agriculture and Agri-Food Exports**

PEI's agriculture and agri-food sector is export-oriented. PEI's agriculture exports include primary agricultural commodities and processed food products. Agriculture and agri-food exports represent a major part of the province's exports. PEI's agriculture and agri-food sector exports increased by 3.23% in 2024, reaching an all-time high for the third consecutive year. PEI's agriculture and agri-food exports (excluding aquaculture) in 2024 represented about 40.41% of the province's total exports (all sectors) and 1.15% of Canada's total agriculture and agri-food exports.

## PEI's Top Agriculture and Agri-Food Export Products

PEI's agriculture and agri-food exports comprise a diverse range of products. Fresh or chilled and processed potatoes represent about 88.73% of PEI's total agriculture and agri-food exports. Other major agriculture and agri-food exports include fresh and frozen wild blueberries, vegetables, grains, and animal products.



Fresh and processed potatoes contributed about \$935.95 million in international sales in 2024. Prepared or preserved potatoes represented 79.16% (valuing \$740.87 million) of PEI total potato exports, followed by fresh potatoes (20.14%), valued at \$188.50 million. In 2024, dehydrated potato products and seed potatoes accounted for less than 1% of PEI total potato exports.

Blueberries represent the second largest agricultural export in PEI. Almost all of the blueberries cultivated in PEI are wild blueberries. Highbush blueberries account for less than 1% of total blueberry production in PEI. Blueberry exports increased substantially in 2022, reaching a historical all-time record. In 2024, total wild blueberry exports increased to \$65.40 million, up from \$57.38 million in 2023. In 2024, PEI blueberries were exported to the United States (US) and Japan.





# PEI's Top Export Markets

PEI's agriculture and agrifood products are shipped around the world. The US is the largest agriculture and agri-food importer of PEI products. In 2024, the US accounted for 91.86% of PEI's total agriculture and agri-food exports, with sales valued at \$969 million (a \$30 million increase from 2023). Trinidad and Tobago, Panama, Indonesia, and Dominican Republic were among PEI's top five agriculture agri-food export markets in 2024. About 95.79% of PEI's agriculture and agri-food exports were sent to its top five markets.

The US is a major destination for PEI potatoes. In 2024, PEI potato exports to the US totaled \$859 million (equating to 91.83% of PEI's total potato exports). Trinidad and Tobago, Panama, Indonesia, and the Dominican Republic were on the PEI's top five potato export markets. In 2024, the value of potato exports increased by 6.12% compared to 2023.
