A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 192 of Chapter 17 of the Acts passed by the Legislature of Prince Edward Island in the 1st Session thereof held in the year 2007 and in the fifty-sixth year of Our Reign intituled "Securities Act" it is enacted as follows:

"This Act comes into force on a date that may be fixed by proclamation of the Lieutenant Governor in Council."

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that sections 1, 13, 168, 169, 171 and 174 of the said Act, Stats. P.E.I. 2007, 1st Session, c. 17 should come into force on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2008, and that the remaining sections, EXCEPT sections 86(3), 87, 103 and 184, should come into force on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2008;

NOW KNOW YE that We, by and with the advice and consent of our Executive Council for Prince Edward Island, do by this Our Proclamation ORDER AND DECLARE that sections 1, 13, 168, 169, 171 and 174 of the said Act being the "Securities Act" passed in the fifty-sixth year of Our Reign shall come into force on the eleventh day of February two thousand and eight, and that the remaining sections,

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EXCEPT sections 86(3), 87, 103 and 184, shall come into force on the seventeenth day of March, two thousand and eight, of which all persons concerned are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

  - (c) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for a person appointed to make an investigation under section 30 of the Act;
  - (d) for disbursements properly incurred by a person appointed to make an investigation under section 30 of the Act, the total amount disbursed;
  - (e) fees properly incurred by the Superintendent for legal services;
  - (f) for disbursements properly incurred in connection with the provision of legal services, the total amount disbursed.
- Hearing costs      **4.** For any order made by the Superintendent in relation to hearing costs under section 63 of the Act, the following fees and charges are recoverable:
- (a) \$1000 for each day or partial day of hearing;

  - (c) fees paid to a person appointed to conduct a review under section 85 of the Act;
