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PB09-5 PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND POTATO BOARD

Board Order: PB09-5 Effective: December 4, 2009

UNDER the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3, the Prince Edward Island Potato Marketing Plan Regulations, and the *Agricultural Products Marketing Act* (Canada), the Prince Edward Island Potato Board makes the following order:

POTATO PROCESSING CONTRACT NEGOTIATION ORDER

Application

 This order applies to dealings between potato producers and potato processors to arrive upon the form and content of contracts for the supply of potatoes for processing by processors.

Definitions 2. In this order:

- (1) "Act" means Natural Products Marketing Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3;
- (2) "Board" means the Prince Edward Island Potato Board;
- (3) "Contract" means a contract for the supply of Potatoes for Processing by a Processor;
- (4) "Negotiating Committee" means each committee consisting of representatives of the Board and representatives of a Processor engaged in negotiations to establish the terms and conditions applicable to the purchase of Processing Potatoes for a crop year or years:
- (5) "Person" includes individual, cooperative, partnership, or corporation;
- (6) "Plan" means any plan for the marketing of potatoes established and amended from time to time pursuant to the Act;

- (7) "Potatoes" means potatoes produced in Prince Edward Island;
- (8) "Processing" means
 - (a) canning, dehydrating, chipping, drying, freezing, peeling or processing with any chemical or by heat and combining or mixing potatoes with one or more other vegetable, or
 - (b) entering into a contract for the purchase of potatoes for the purpose of performing on the potatoes any of the operations mentioned in clause (a);
- (9) "Processing Potatoes" means potatoes produced in Prince Edward Island that are used by a Processor for Processing;
- (10) "Processor" means a person who, on his own behalf or as an agent for or on behalf of any other person, is engaged in the Processing of Potatoes;
- (11) "Producer" means a person engaged in the production of potatoes for his own account.

Mandate

- 3. The mandate of a Negotiating Committee is to negotiate and agree upon a contract governing the purchase and sale of potatoes for Processing purposes by a Processor, addressing the following items:
 - minimum contract prices for Processing Potatoes or for any variety, grade or size of Processing Potatoes;
 - (2) bonuses and penalties applicable to Processing Potatoes;
 - (3) terms and conditions respecting storage and delivery of Processing Potatoes; and
 - (4) any charges, costs, or expenses relating to the production or delivery of Processing Potatoes to the Processor.

Factors

- 4. The Negotiating Committee shall, in its negotiations, take into account the following factors:
 - the prices or projected prices paid for potatoes by competing Processors in competing market areas;
 - the quantity or projected quantity of potato production in Prince Edward Island and competing market areas;
 - (3) the average cost of production of potatoes produced for Processing purposes;
 - (4) prior contracts entered into by the Processor; and
 - (5) other factors which historically had been taken into consideration in arriving at contracts for the sale of potatoes for Processing Potatoes.

Composition of Committees

5. (1) A Negotiating Committee shall be established with respect to each Processor engaged in the business of processing potatoes produced in Prince Edward Island.

- (2) Each Negotiating Committee shall consist of a maximum of six representatives of the Board and a maximum of six representatives of a Processor.
- (3) (a) Each Negotiating Committee shall be established by January 1 of each year for the purpose of negotiating a contract for Processing Potatoes for potatoes grown in that calendar year.
 - (b) Notwithstanding clause (3)(a), Negotiating Committees for crops grown in 2010 shall be established by January 15, 2010.
 - (c) Notwithstanding clauses (3)(a) and (3)(b), a Negotiating Committee shall not be appointed with respect to any Processor in respect of which a contract governing the purchase and sale of Processing Potatoes already exists for Potatoes grown in that calendar year.
- (4) Failure by either of the Board or the Processor to name any representatives to a Negotiating Committee by the required date of any year shall entitle the party who has appointed representatives to the Negotiating Committee to immediately invoke mediation in accordance with section 7 below.

Timelines

- 6. (1) Upon a Negotiating Committee being established, it shall immediately commence negotiations to establish all terms and conditions respecting the form and content of a contract for use by a Processor in the purchase of Processing Potatoes for that crop year, and, if the parties so agree, for subsequent crop years.
 - (2) Should a Negotiating Committee agree to do so prior to the appointment of a mediator pursuant to section 7, the terms and conditions of a contract shall be submitted to a vote of Producers who held contracts for Processing Potatoes with such Processor in the prior crop year. If the terms and conditions are approved by such vote, such terms and conditions shall be approved by the Board, and constitute the form of contract to be used by the Processor for purchasing Potatoes pursuant to section 10. If the terms and conditions are rejected by the vote of Producers, the Negotiating Committee shall continue its negotiations.

Mediation

- 7. (1) A Negotiating Committee may, by a majority vote of each of the Board representatives and the Processor representatives on such Committee, request mediation of outstanding issues at any time. Upon the request for mediation being made, and the mediator selected pursuant to subsection (3) below, a mediation session shall be held for a duration at the mediator's discretion, but in any event to be no longer than five days.
 - (2) If, by the last Friday in March of each year, a Negotiating Committee has not agreed upon the terms and conditions of a contract to be submitted to a vote of Producers, the outstanding issues shall be submitted to mediation, such mediation to take place within one week of the last Friday in March, for a duration at the mediator's discretion, but in any event to be no longer than three days.
 - (3) The mediator shall be selected on or before March 15 of each year, and shall be selected from a list consisting of an odd number of names prepared by the Prince Edward Island Marketing Council, and, in the absence of a mutual agreement between the representatives of the Board and representatives of the Processor on the Negotiating Committee, shall be selected by each of the Board representatives and Processor representatives eliminating names from the list in alternate sequence until the name of one individual remains, which individual shall be the mediator. The order of striking names from the list shall be determined by chance.

- (4) If, as a result of the mediation, the Negotiating Committee agrees upon the terms and conditions to be submitted to a vote of Producers, such terms and conditions shall be submitted to a vote of Producers who held contracts for Processing Potatoes with such Processor in the previous crop year. If the terms and conditions are approved by the vote, the Board shall approve the form of contract, and the contract shall be the contract used by the Processor for that crop year in accordance with section 10 below. If the Producers vote to reject the terms and conditions, the outstanding issues shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with section 8 below.
- (5) A Negotiating Committee may, by a majority vote of each of the Board representatives and Processor representatives on the Committee, agree at any time to submit outstanding issues to arbitration.

Arbitration

- 8. (1) If, by April 15 of each year, a Negotiating Committee has not been able to agree upon all terms and conditions respecting the contract for use by a Processor in the purchase of Processing Potatoes for that crop year, all outstanding issues shall be submitted to binding arbitration.
 - (2) The arbitrator shall be selected by the Negotiating Committee from the list referred to in subsection 7(3) above. The arbitrator may be the same person who carried out mediation pursuant to section 7 above.
 - (3) Within seven days of April 15, the representatives of the Board and the representatives of the Processor on the Negotiating Committee must submit to the arbitrator and to the other party a concise written statement of the unresolved matters and their respective final offers, with any supporting documentation on which they intend to rely, addressing each unresolved matter. Neither the representatives of the Board nor the representatives of the Processor may raise issues in the arbitration which have not been previously discussed in negotiations.
 - (4) Each side shall have three days following submission of the written statements to file any reply to the written statements, and if either or both parties wish to appear in person before the arbitrator, they must do so within five days of filing any reply material.
 - (5) The arbitrator shall render a decision within seven days of submission of the reply to the written statements, or the in-person submissions before the arbitrator, as the case may be, and shall select one of the final offers made in its entirety, without modification.
 - (6) The arbitrator, in making his decision, shall consider the factors outlined in section 4.

Delegation

- Upon the selection of an arbitrator, the Board shall delegate to the arbitrator, for the purpose of establishing a binding contract on buyers and sellers of Processing Potatoes, the Board's powers:
 - (a) to regulate the time and place at which Processing Potatoes are to be marketed:
 - (b) to determine the manner of distribution, the quantity and quality or grade of Processing Potatoes that are to be marketed;

- to prohibit any aspect of the marketing of any grade or quality of Processing Potatoes;
- (d) to fix prices at which Processing Potatoes shall be bought or sold in the province.

Contract 10.

- (1) The final terms and conditions as negotiated by the Negotiating Committee and approved by a vote of Producers, or determined by the arbitrator, as the case may be, shall be binding upon the Board, the Processor and all Persons selling potatoes for processing to the Processor, and shall apply to all contracts entered into by that Processor prior to September 1 of that crop year for the purchase of Processing Potatoes from that crop year.
- (2) Contracts for the purchase and sale of Processing Potatoes entered into subsequent to September 1 of a crop year may incorporate some or all of the terms and conditions of the master form of contract.
- (3) (a) The Processor shall prepare, sign and deliver to the Board two copies of the master form of contract within two business days of agreement by the Negotiating Committee, or determination by the arbitrator, as the case may be. The Board shall sign and return one copy of the master contract to the Processor within three business days.
 - (b) With respect to multi-year contracts, the Processor shall, in each year after the year in which the contract was negotiated, on or before the last Friday in March of that year, prepare, sign and deliver to the Board within two business days two copies of the master form of contract. The Board shall sign and return one copy of the master contract to the Processor within three business days.
- (4) All contracts between the Processor and Persons who wish to sell potatoes for processing to the Processor shall be signed within five business days of receipt by the Processor of the master contract signed by the Board.

Expenses

 All expenses of the mediator and arbitrator shall be divided evenly between the Board and the Processor.

Confidentiality

12. Each member of a Negotiating Committee shall annually execute a confidentiality agreement in which the member agrees to maintain all confidential business information acquired during the deliberations of the Negotiating Committee in confidence, and not to disclose the information to any third party for any reason whatsoever, unless such information has become part of the public domain through no fault by anyone having a similar duty of confidentiality.

Failure to Comply

If the representatives of the Board or representatives of the Processor fail to participate in any step of the process contemplated by this order, the process shall continue notwithstanding the non-compliance by the defaulting representatives.

Pursuant to section 33 of the *Teachers' Superannuation Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. T-1, Council made the following regulations:

Definitions

1. In these regulations

Act

(a) "Act" means the *Teachers' Superannuation Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. T-1;

commuted value

(b) "commuted value" means the value of a benefit, determined in accordance with the Standard of Practice for Determining Pension Commuted Values, adopted by the Canadian Institute of Actuaries effective February 1, 2005, as amended from time to time, to the extent that the recommendations are consistent with the Act and these regulations;

locked-in retirement vehicle

- (c) "locked-in retirement vehicle" means
 - (i) a registered retirement savings plan, registered retirement income fund or registered pension plan as defined in the *Income Tax Act* (Canada), or
 - (ii) a life annuity purchased from an insurance company licensed to sell annuities in Canada, which states in writing that, while the spouse or former spouse is alive

- (A) any amount in the locked-in retirement vehicle shall continue to be subject to section 31.8 of the Act,
- (B) in the case of a registered retirement savings plan, payments are allowed only to another locked-in retirement vehicle.
- (C) in the case of a registered retirement income fund or a registered pension plan, payments are allowed only to another locked-in retirement vehicle or to the spouse or former spouse,
- (D) in the case of a registered retirement income fund, the total cash payments to the spouse or former spouse during the first year after the date the registered retirement income fund is entered into shall not exceed twice the amount initially transferred into the fund divided by the difference between 90 and the age of the spouse or former spouse (to the nearest whole number) at the transfer date and, during subsequent years, shall not exceed twice the minimum annual payments required by the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) to be made from the fund to the spouse or former spouse,
- (E) in the case of a registered pension plan, payments to the spouse or former spouse shall be monthly lifetime payments in a form which is allowed under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) to a member of a registered pension plan who retires, and
- (F) in the case of a life annuity, only payments in a form to the spouse or former spouse are allowed and such payments shall be monthly lifetime payments in a form which is allowed under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada) to a member of a registered pension plan who retires.

CALCULATION OF THE AMOUNTS SUBJECT TO DIVISION

2. (1) Subject to section 3, if the lump-sum value of the benefit of a Formula member, vested former member or pensioner is to be divided on marriage breakdown, the lump-sum amount subject to division shall equal

A/BxC

where "A" is

- (i) the number of years and part years of service included in "B" that were credited to the member, vested former member or pensioner in the period between the date of the marriage and the date of marriage breakdown, plus
- (ii) the number of years and part years of service completed prior to the date of the marriage which was not included to calculate benefits at the date of the marriage but was credited to the member, vested former member or pensioner during the period between the date of the marriage and the date of marriage breakdown and is included in "B" at the date of marriage breakdown,

where "B" is

- (i) the total number of years and part years of service which would be used to calculate the pension benefit of the member as if the member had terminated employment on the date of marriage breakdown, or
- (ii) the total number of years and part years of service used to calculate the pension benefit of the vested former member or pensioner upon termination of employment where the vested former member or pensioner terminated employment before the date of marriage breakdown,

where "C" is

the total value of the benefit determined as of the date of marriage breakdown in subsections (2) and (3).

Calculation of total value of benefit "C"

- (2) In subsection (1), the value of "C" shall be
 - (a) in the case of a member who did not have a vested right to an accrued pension at the date of marriage breakdown, the member's contributions under the Act accumulated with interest to the date of marriage breakdown, and prior to any adjustment in the member's contributions being made with respect to any previous marriage breakdown;
 - (b) in the case of a member who had a vested right to an accrued pension at the date of marriage breakdown, the commuted value of the accrued pension at the date of marriage breakdown based on the salary history, the contribution history and the benefit formula in force at the time and prior to any adjustment to the accrued pension respecting any previous marriage breakdown or, if greater than the commuted value, the member's contributions and interest to the date of marriage breakdown prior to any adjustment in the member's contributions respecting any previous marriage breakdown;
 - (c) in the case of a vested former member, the commuted value of the accrued pension at the date of marriage breakdown before any adjustment to the accrued pension respecting any previous marriage breakdown or, if greater than the commuted value, the former member's contributions and interest to the date of marriage breakdown before any adjustment in the former member's contributions respecting any previous marriage breakdown; or
 - (d) in the case of a pensioner, the commuted value of the pension to which the pensioner was entitled at the date of marriage breakdown as if there had been no adjustment respecting any previous division of benefits on any previous marriage breakdown.

Survivor benefits and indexing included

- (3) The commuted value calculated under subsection (2) shall include
 - (a) the value of survivor benefits under the Act, both before the commencement of payment of a deferred pension and while the pension is in payment; and
 - (b) the value of any annual increases under section 21 of the Act.

(4) Where "B", in subsection (1), includes service transferred from when service is another pension plan under a reciprocal transfer agreement entered into pursuant to section 30 of the Act, "A" shall include only that portion of the transferred service that was credited to the member, vested former member or pensioner under the other pension plan between the date of the marriage and the date of transfer of the service.

(5) For the purposes of subsection 31.5(3) of the Act, determination of Gender neutral the commuted value transferred into the prescribed locked-in retirement vehicle, pension plan or annuity shall be made without regard to the gender of the member.

"S" is the percentage share of benefits of the spouse or former spouse, as defined in a court order or domestic contract but in no case shall the share exceed 50 per cent of the lump-sum value of the pension benefit of the member, vested former member or pensioner.

"S" is the spouse's or former spouse's percentage share of benefits as defined in a court order or domestic contract, but in no case shall the share exceed 50 per cent.

Adjustment after 65

(5) The adjustment applied to the pension after the pensioner reaches sixty-five years of age shall bear the same proportion to the adjustment applied to the pension before the pensioner reaches sixty-five years of age as the total pension after age sixty-five bears to the total pension prior to age sixty-five.

TRANSFER AMOUNTS LOCKED-IN

Restriction on transfers **6.** (1) Any amount transferred in accordance with subsection 31.5(3) of the Act shall be transferred only to a locked-in retirement vehicle.

(2) Where, within 90 days after receiving notice of the options for Default transfer transfer, the spouse or former spouse fails to direct the Minister in accordance with subsection 31.5(3) of the Act, the spouse or former spouse shall be deemed to have directed the Minister to purchase a life annuity in accordance with clause 31.5(3)(c) of the Act.

SECTION 7 lists the contents of the application form for division and the supporting documentation that must be submitted.

NOTICE

Section 3 of the Vital Statistics Act provides

- **3.** (1) Within thirty days after the birth of a child in the province, at least one parent of the child or another prescribed person shall, in accordance with the regulations, complete and provide a statement respecting the birth and the parents to the division registrar.
- (2) If a pregnancy results in the birth of more than one child, a separate statement for each child shall be completed and provided in accordance with subsection (1), and each statement shall state the number of children born and their order of birth.
- (3) Where a registered statement is completed by only one parent of the child or by a person who is not the child's parent, the Director shall amend the statement on application of any of the following persons:
 - (a) the child's parents together;
 - (b) one of the child's parents, if the other parent is incapable;
 - (c) the child's mother, if the other parent is unacknowledged by or unknown to the mother.

- (4) If only one parent of the child applies to amend the statement, a statutory declaration of the facts justifying the application shall be attached to the application.
- (5) Where parentage is established under the *Child Status Act*, the Director shall, on receipt of a copy of the order, make a notation on the statement of the child to reflect the determination of parentage.

Extracts from "Vital Statistics Act"

"Stillbirth" means the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother, after at least 20 weeks' pregnancy or after attaining a weight of at least 500 grams, of a product of conception in which, after such expulsion or extraction, there is no breathing, beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbitical cord, or unmistakable movement of voluntary muscle.

- 11.(1) Where a stillbirth occurs, the person who would have been responsible for the registration thereof as provided in section 3, if it had been a birth, shall complete and provide to the funeral director a statement in the prescribed form respecting the stillbirth.
- (3) Upon receipt of the statement, the funeral director shall complete the statement setting forth the proposed date and place of burial, cremation or other disposition of the body and shall provide the statement to the division registrar.

In case of more than one stillborn child at a birth, a separate return must be made for each, and the number of each, in order of birth, stated.

- (1) Name of Child. In place of the given name the word "Stillbirth" may be printed.
- (15) Name of Father/Other Parent In the case of the parents not being married, the name of the father/other parent shall not appear on the certificate unless accompanied by his-her and the mother's written request.
- (33) Physician's Statement of Cause of Stilbirth. The morbid conditions relating to stilbirth are divided into two groups. In Part I are those causally related to the "Immediate Cause" and the Antecodent causes, and in Part II those not so related. In most cases a statement of cause under Part I will suffice. When it is necessary to record more than one entry these should be stated in order to as to indicate their mutual relationship.
- (a) Name first the "Immediate Cause" of stilibirth, i.e., the foetal disease, injury or complication which caused the stilibirth. Avoid the use of such terms as "Prematurity", "Birth Injury", "Cerebral Haemorthage", "Asphyxia", etc., alone without stating, if possible, the primary factor responsible for these conditions.
- (b) Then give the antecedent causes, i.e. the foetal and/or maternal conditions (if any) of which the immediate cause was the consequence, in order of causal relationship, stating the most recent one first and then others in order. Also check off whether the reported condition was a foetal or "maternal condition."
- (c) Part II should be reserved for "other important contributory morbid conditions", particularly when the stillbirth was due to a combination of conditions none of which would have been fatal alone. Here too, check off whether "botta" or 'maternal'.
- (d) Use accepted terms for morbid conditions and never record mere symptoms only
- The following examples illustrate the essential principles in the use of the form.

Every clergyman, minister or other person authorized by the law of the Province to solemnized marriages shall, at the time of each marriage make a written record thereof in the form prescribed and every such record shall be signed by each of the parties to the marriage and by the minister, clergyman or other person authorized as aforesaid officiating and by at least two credible witnesses.

Every clergyman, minister or other person authorized as aforesaid shall, within forty-eight hours from and after the solemnization by him or her of a marriage, deliver or forward by letter to the Registrar General a complete record thereof according to the prescribed form.

WORKERS COMPENSATION ACT GENERAL REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

RECREATION DEVELOPMENT ACT ENFORCEMENT REGULATIONS

1. A conservation officer appointed under the *Wildlife Conservation Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. W-4.1 has the power and authority to enforce the *Recreation Development Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-8 and the regulations made under the *Recreation Development Act*.

Commencement

2. These regulations come into force on December 19, 2009.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 provides conservation officers appointed under the *Wildlife Conservation Act* the power and authority to enforce the *Recreation Development Act* and the regulations made under the *Recreation Development Act*.

SECTION 2 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
