Under the Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island Regulations and under the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. N-3, Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island makes the following Order:

# MILK PRODUCER QUOTA EXCHANGE ORDER

Application

 This Order provides for the establishment, control and operation by the Board of a Quota Exchange to be operated for milk producers.

Definitions

- 2. The words herein shall have the meanings as found in the *Prince Edward Island Natural Products Marketing Act* and the Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island Regulations unless differentiated herein, and as hereinafter defined:
  - (a) "cleared" shall mean the process by which the Board shall conduct the buying and selling of quotas which results in the purchase and sale of quotas.
  - (b) "daily quota" shall mean the amount of kilograms of butterfat quota assigned to a producer by the Board, expressed to two decimal places.
  - (c) "exchange month" shall mean the calendar month in which a producer's quota shall be adjusted by the amount of quota purchased or sold on the exchange.
  - (d) "market clearing price" shall be the price at which the amount of quota offered for sale on an exchange equals, or comes closest to, the amount of quota bid for, except that where the volume is the same for more than one price, the lowest price shall be used.

Exchange established

- 3. The Board hereby establishes a quota exchange, to be operated by the Board, for the purchase and sale of daily quota held by milk producers.
- Eligible producers 4. Only producers registered by the Board shall be eligible to participate on the quota exchange.

Offer prices

5. Effective 1 August 2015, the price at which milk producers may offer to sell or purchase quota on the exchange is limited to a maximum of twenty four thousand dollars (\$24,000.00) per Kg of daily quota.

Bids to be Excluded

6. Any bid to purchase or sell quota that exceeds the monthly maximum specified in this order shall be excluded from the exchange and returned to the bidder.

Offer amounts

7. Producers may offer to sell or purchase any amount of daily quota in increments of 0.1 kilograms, except when a producers is exiting the industry he may sell all quota measured to two decimal places. A producer may not offer to sell more than the amount of the seller's quota holdings.

Offer forms

Producers offering to sell or purchase quota on the exchange shall only submit offers on a form provided by, or approved by, the Board.

Delivery of forms 9. Offers to sell or purchase quota must be received at the Board Office by the close of business on the 15th of the month prior to the exchange month. The Board will accept a facsimile copy of an offer to sell or purchase quota on or prior to the close of business on the 15th of the month, provided that the producer mails an original signed copy of the form to the Board within one day of the facsimile copy being sent.

Weekends and holidays

10. Where the 15th of a month falls on a weekend or a statutory holiday, the Board shall accept offers to sell or purchase quota up to the close of business on the next business day.

Change or cancellation of offers

11. A producer may change or cancel an offer to sell or purchase quota provided that such change or cancellation is made in writing and the notice of change or cancellation is received at the board office prior to the close of business on the 15th of the month prior to the exchange month.

Determination of market clearing price

- 12. Offers to sell and bids to purchase quota shall be used to establish the market clearing price of the exchange in the following manner:
  - (1) Offers to sell quota shall be accumulated based on the prices at which the quota is offered for sale, from the lowest to the highest price offered.
  - (2) Offers to purchase shall be accumulated based on the prices at which producers have bid for quota, from the highest price to the lowest bid price.
  - (3) If no point is reached where the amount of quota offered for sale is equal to, or nearly equals, the amount of quota bid for on an exchange, the exchange shall be deemed to have not cleared and no transactions shall take place on that exchange.
- Selection process 13. Where the amount of quota offered for sale and bid for at the clearing price does not equal, the Board shall distribute the available quota in the following manner:
  - (1) If the amount of quota offered for sale at or below the clearing price is greater than the amount of quota bid for at the clearing price, the Board shall sell the quota offered for sale based on the order in which the offers to sell were received at the board office.
  - (2) If the amount of quota bid for at or above the clearing price is greater than the amount of quota offered for sale at the clearing price, the amount of quota sold shall be distributed in 0.01 kilogram lots until the amount of quota offered for sale at or below the clearing price is fully distributed.
  - (3) If a registered producer submits more than one bid to purchase quota then the registered producer's bids, which are at or above the clearing price, will be cumulated and considered as one bid for the distribution of quota as described in section 13 (2) (above).

Clearing date

14. The Board shall establish the clearing price, clear the exchange and release the exchange results by noon of the second business day following the last day the bids for the exchange are accepted.

Settlements

- 15. Producers offering to purchase quota on an exchange shall provide the Board with one of the following:
  - (1) A cheque, payable to the Board, which covers the full amount of the offer to purchase, plus the appropriate service charge, dated no later than the 25th of the month prior to the exchange month, or

(2) A letter from a reputable financial institution or legal firm that indicates the amount of the offer to purchase will be paid to the Board on the date required.

### Deposit

of cheques

16. The Board shall deposit cheques for successful purchases on the 25th of the month prior to the exchange month except that where the 25th falls on a weekend or a statutory holiday the Board shall deposit the cheques on the next business day.

# Settlements to

purchasers

17. The Board shall issue settlements to purchasers of quota for overpayments on the tenth (10th) day of the exchange month.

#### Settlements to

sellers

18. The Board shall issue settlements to sellers of quota on the tenth (10th) day of the exchange month.

# Adjustments to

producer quotas

19. The Board shall debit sellers quota with the amount of quota sold and credit purchasers quota with the amount of quota purchased on the 1st day of the exchange month.

# Service charges

20. Producers shall pay to the Board a service charge of \$3.00 for each successful offer to sell or purchase quota and for each change in an offer as provided for in Section 11.

# Failure to pay

for quota

21. Where a producer fails to pay the Board for the amount of quota purchased, or where a cheque provided to the Board by a producer in payment of quota purchased has been dishonoured by a financial institution, the Board shall offer a sufficient amount of the producer's quota on the next exchange to clear the total amount owing to the Board, at the clearing price of that exchange, provided the producer has not paid the Board by the exchange clearing date.

# Unsuccessful

offers

22. Producers who are not successful in purchasing quota on an exchange shall have their cheques returned to them on the day the exchange clears.

### Accounting

23. The Board shall maintain accounting records for the operation of the exchange and shall submit audited financial statements on the records of the exchange at its annual meeting and make an accounting of its operation based on the fiscal year of the Board.

### MARKETING ORDER AMENDING ORDER

Application

 This Order applies to the control and regulation of the production and marketing of milk in the province of Prince Edward Island and amends certain provisions of Board Order DFPEI 2012-07.

Definition

- 2. The words herein shall have the meanings as found in the *Natural Products Marketing Act* and the Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island Regulations and in this Order:
  - (a) "Producer" means a person who holds quota and has no other interest in any other quota, who markets or sells milk that has been produced by a herd of dairy animals owned or controlled by the producer;
  - (b) "Quota" means a producer's share of the market for milk products as determined by the Board and assigned to a producer by the Board.

Amendment

- 3. The following subsections shall be added to Section 17:
  - (9) all applications for transfers must be presented to the Board on a form provided by or approved by the Board, and must be received by the Board not later than the fifteenth day of the month prior to the month in which the transfer will be executed; and
  - (10) all transfers approved by the Board shall be executed effective as of the first day of the month following the month in which the transfer is approved, or the first day of another future month if selected by the applicants.

Commencement 4. This Order comes into force on the 1st day of September 2015.

Order No.: Effective: CP2015-01 August 8, 2015

UNDER the *Natural Products Marketing Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988 Cap. N-3, and the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers Commodity Marketing Board Regulations, the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers makes the following order:

#### **Dead Stock Service Levies Order**

Short title

 This order may be cited as the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers Dead Stock Service Levies Order.

Application

This order applies to the fixing, imposing and collecting of dead stock levies payable by all beef producers in the Province of Prince Edward Island.

Interpretation

- 3. The words herein shall have the meanings as found in the Prince Edward Island *Natural Products Marketing Act* and the Cattle Marketing Board Regulations unless differentiated herein and as hereinafter defined:
  - a. "Backgrounder Producer" means a producer which adds value to calves (either owned by the producer or custom fed for other producers) in the form of weight gain in preparation for feedlot production.
  - b. "Bob/Veal Calf Producer" means a producer who raises dairy type calves for beef
  - c. "Category" means any one of the categories of cow-calf producer, a backgrounder producer, a feedlot producer, bob/veal calf producer, dairy beef producer or a drover.
  - d. "Cow-Calf Producer" means a producer which maintains a permanent herd of breeding cows, heifers and, where necessary, bulls; for the purpose of producing calves.
  - e. "Dairy Beef Producer" means any producer who raises dairy type cattle for the purpose of beef.
  - f. "Dairy Type Cattle" means cattle of the Holstein, Jersey, Shorthorn, Ayrshire or Guernsey varieties;
  - g. "Dead Stock Service Levy" means the levy which will be billed to each producer annually no later than March 31 of each year.
  - h. "Dead Stock Service Provider" means an entity which physically removes dead cattle stock from a farm and is responsible for its disposal.
  - i. "Discounted Levy" means the actual dead stock service levy that a producer must pay if such producer has registered pursuant to Section 7 by January 31 of each year.
  - j. "Drover" means a person who buys cattle from producers for resale to slaughter houses, to producers or through auction barns.

- k. "Feedlot Producer" means a producer which raises cattle during the final stage of production prior to processing.
- l. "Quota Holder" means any cattle producer who is a quota holder as defined in the Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island Regulations.
- 4. The mortality rate for any cow/calf, background, dairy beef, feedlot producer or drover shall be determined as follows:
  - a. each producer shall be deemed to have cattle inventory (in the case of cow-calf producers) or cattle marketings (in the case of background producer, dairy beef producer, feed lot producer or drover) in the maximum amount stated for the range of such cattle inventory or cattle marketings set forth in Schedule "2" in which the producer's actual cattle inventory or cattle marketings, as the case may be, falls;
  - b. the amount determined in accordance with subparagraph (a) shall be divided into the number of dead stock picked up from such producer in the previous year, as determined from the pickup slips to December 31 of each year provided by the dead stock service provider.
- The mortality rate for any bob/veal calf producer shall be deemed to be 10% of their average yearly cattle purchases.

Exemption

- 6. A producer shall be exempt from having to pay Dead Stock Service Levy to the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers if the producer:
  - a. Shows proof of being a quota holder under the Dairy Farmers of Prince Edward Island Regulations; or
  - b. Has undergone an on-farm audit of the producer's deadstock compost site; has met the provincial requirements for on-farm composting of dead livestock: and has paid to the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers, the on-farm compost audit fee of \$180.00 plus HST.

Requirement to Register

7. Every cattle producer shall register with the Board annually by January 31 of each year by completion of the cattle producer registration form set forth as Schedule "1" to this order.

Levy

- Every producer shall pay to the Board Dead Stock Service Levy based on the following categories:
  - a. Every cow-calf producer shall pay to the Board annual Dead Stock Service Levy based on their cattle inventory as determined in accordance with Schedule 1 & 2 to this order.
  - b. Every backgrounder producer, dairy beef producer, feedlot producer and drover shall pay to the Board annual Dead Stock Service Levy based on their annual cattle marketings determined in accordance with Schedule 1 & 2 to this Board Order.
  - c. Every Bob/Veal Calf Producer shall pay to the Board Dead Stock Service Levy based on their average yearly cattle purchases at the rate of \$25.00/hd on the number of animals that represent 10% of their average yearly purchases.

d. Any producer who falls into more than one category of producer shall be invoiced based on the combination of the producer's categories.

### Failure to Register

- 9. If a cattle producer fails to submit the registration form set forth in Schedule "1" by January 31 of each year, then such producer's inventory or marketings (depending upon the category of such producer) shall be determined by the Board to be the greater of the following, and the Dead Stock Service Levy payable by such producer determined by such calculation:
  - a. an amount determined by assuming that the producer's dead stock pickups in the previous year constituted six percent of such producer's inventory or marketings (depending on the category of producer); or
  - b. an estimate of such producer's inventory or marketings (depending on the category of producer) estimated by the Board in good faith.
  - c. With respect to Bob/Veal Calf Producers, the levy shall be determined by an estimate of the Bob/Veal Calf Producer's average yearly purchases.

### On Farm Composting

10. A producer may undergo an on-farm audit of the producer's deadstock compost site in lieu of paying the Dead Stock Service Levy. Upon completion of the audit, if the producer meets the provincial requirements for on-farm composting of dead livestock, the producer will be considered to be in good standing with the PEICP. Audits must be completed annually at the cost of \$180.00 plus HST. To request an audit, a producer must sign and submit the on-farm composting questionnaire (Appendix 1)

- High Use Levy 11. Any cow-calf producer, background producer, dairy beef producer, feedlot producer or drover having a mortality rate above six percent of their inventory or marketings, will be assessed an additional High Use levy of \$100 per head for every dead animal picked up by the Dead Stock Service Provider in the previous year in excess of the six percent mortality rate. High Use levies will be invoiced at the same time as the levy set forth in Section 8.
  - 12. Any bob/veal calf producer having a mortality rate above ten percent of their average yearly purchases, will be assessed an additional High Use levy of \$25 per head for every dead animal picked up by the Dead Stock Service Provider in the previous year in excess of the ten percent mortality rate. High Use levies will be invoiced at the same time as the levy set forth in Section 8.

### Statement

of Receipts

13. When requested to do so by the Board, every registered producer shall forward to the Board, records to support the information they reported on their registration forms.

### Method of

Payment

- 14. Remittances of Dead Stock Service Levies are payable to The Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers and are due 30 days after the date invoices are issued in March of each year.
- 15. Notwithstanding subsection (15), a producer who's Dead Stock Service Levies are greater than \$500 annually may pay such levies in three equal installments on March 31, June 30 and September 30 of each year.

# Arrears

and Penalties

- 16. Any Dead Stock Service Provider shall be given a list of all producers who's Dead Stock Service Levies are up to date.
  - a. Any producer whose levy payment installments are outstanding for 60 days shall not be in good standing with Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers.

- b. No pick-up service will be available for producers who are not in good standing with the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers.
- c. A producer not in good standing must allow up to seven days for a payment to be processed before the Dead Stock Service Provider will be notified that the producer is in good standing.
- d. A list of producers in good standing will be shared with the PEI Department of Agriculture and the PEI Department of Environment and updated periodically.
- e. An additional administration fee of 2.5% will be added monthly to any account that is in arrears sixty days or more.
- f. Producers who do not pay their Dead Stock Service Levies will not be eligible for programs offered through the Prince Edward Island Cattle Producers.

#### EC2015-463

#### ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT DRINKING WATER AND WASTEWATER **FACILITY OPERATING REGULATIONS AMENDMENT**

(Approved by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated July 28, 2015.)

Pursuant to section 25 of the Environmental Protection Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-9, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Subsection 1(1) of the Environmental Protection Act Drinking Water and Wastewater Facility Operating Regulations (EC710/04) is amended
  - (a) in clause (b), by the deletion of the words "a public drinking water supply facility, small public drinking water supply facility, water treatment facility, water distribution facility, wastewater treatment facility or wastewater collection facility," and the substitution of the word "facilities";
  - (b) by the revocation of clause (c) and the substitution of the following:
  - (c) "Chief Public Health Officer" means the Chief Public Health Chief Public Health Officer appointed under the Public Health Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. Officer P-30.1;

- (c) in clauses (d) and (e), by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister";
- (d) by the revocation of clause (f);
- (e) by the revocation of clause (h) and the substitution of the following:
- (h) "direct responsible charge experience" or "DRC experience" means experience as an operator having direct responsibility for, and charge experience charge of, a process that controls the effectiveness or efficiency of a facility;

direct responsible or DRC experience

- (f) in clause (i),
  - (i) by the deletion of the words "small public drinking water supply facility,", and
  - (ii) by the deletion of the words ", but does not include a semipublic drinking water supply system";

### (g) by the revocation of clause (j) and the substitution of the following:

facility classification certificate (j) "facility classification certificate" means a facility classification certificate issued or deemed to have been issued pursuant to section 2:

### (h) by the revocation of clause (n) and the substitution of the following:

operator

(n) "operator" means a person who directs, adjusts, inspects, tests or evaluates an operation or a process that controls the effectiveness or efficiency of a facility;

operator-in-charge

- (n.1) "operator-in-charge" means a person, designated pursuant to subsection 4(1) or section 4.1, who has direct responsibility for, and charge of, the overall operation, repair and maintenance of a facility;
- (i) in clause (p), by the deletion of the words "public drinking water supply facility, small public drinking water supply facility, water treatment facility, water distribution facility, wastewater treatment facility, wastewater collection facility or" and the substitution of the words "facility or a";
- (j) by the revocation of clauses (q) and (r) and the substitution of the following:

public drinking water supply facility (q) "public drinking water supply facility" means a water supply facility with five or more service connections that supplies drinking water to the public;

semi-public drinking water supply system

- (r) "semi-public drinking water supply system" means a water supply system with limited distribution, not connected to a public drinking water supply facility, that supplies drinking water to the public;
- (k) by the revocation of clauses (s) and (t).
- 2. (1) Subsection 2(3) of the regulations is amended in the words preceding clause (a), by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (2) Subsections 2(4), (5) and (6) of the regulations are revoked and the following substituted:

(4) Where the Minister determines at any time that a facility requires Reclassification reclassification based on changes in the condition or circumstances of the facility, the Minister may advise the owner of the facility of the Minister's determination in writing and issue a new facility classification certificate for the facility to the owner of the facility.

(5) A facility classification certificate is valid unless or until it is Validity of revoked or replaced by the Minister.

#### 3. Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is revoked and the following substituted:

3. (1) The Minister shall classify a facility in accordance with Schedule Classification A to these regulations, which forms part of these regulations.

- 4. (1) Subsection 4(1) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words "place the responsibility for the operation, repair and maintenance of the facility under the direct responsible charge of" and the substitution of the words "designate, as the operator-in-charge of the facility,".
- (2) Subsection 4(2) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "operator" and the substitution of the words "operator-incharge".
- (3) Subsection 4(3) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words "operator of the facility, the Department may issue a temporary permit to the operator that authorizes the operator to operate the facility" and the substitution of the words "operator-in-charge of the facility, the Minister may issue a temporary permit to the operator-incharge that authorizes him or her to act as the operator-in-charge of the facility".
- (4) Subsection 4(5) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".

#### 5. The regulations are amended by the addition of the following after section 4:

4.1 (1) Notwithstanding section 4, the owner of a Class A water Exception, Class A distribution facility may designate as the operator-in-charge of the facility a person who holds

- (a) a valid certificate of qualification or permit in the plumbing trade issued under the Apprenticeship and Trades Qualification Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. A-15.2; and
- (b) a valid plumbing contractor's license issued under A Code for Plumbing Services Regulations (EC666/86),

and that person may act as the operator-in-charge of the facility.

Exception, wastewater collection facility (2) Notwithstanding section 4, the owner of a Class I wastewater collection facility that serves less than 250 persons may designate as the operator-in-charge of the facility a person who holds a Class B operator's certificate and that person may act as the operator-in-charge of the facility.

Transitional, small facility operator's certificate

- **4.2** A person who, immediately before the date this section comes into force, holds a small facility operator's certificate is deemed on the coming into force of this section to hold a Class B operator's certificate, until the date of expiry of the original certificate, unless it is sooner deemed invalid under these regulations.
- 6. (1) Subsection 7(1) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (2) Subsection 7(2) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" wherever it occurs and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 7. Section 8 of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words "Chief Health Officer" and the substitution of the words "Chief Public Health Officer".
- 8. Sections 9 and 10 of the regulations are revoked and the following substituted:

Monitoring frequency - semi public drinking water supply system

- **9.** Subject to subsection 12(1), the owner of a semi-public drinking water supply system shall ensure that water quality samples are
  - (a) collected and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli at least once per quarter each year; and
  - (b) collected from each source of supply and subjected to a general chemical analysis at least once every three years.

Monitoring frequency, public drinking water supply facility

- **10.** (1) Subject to subsection 12(2), the owner of a public drinking water supply facility classified as a Class B water distribution facility shall ensure that water quality samples are
  - (a) collected from each source of supply, and from at least two sites within the distribution system, and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli at least once per quarter each year; and
  - (b) collected from each source of supply and subjected to a general chemical analysis at least once every three years.

Idem

- (2) Subject to subsection 12(3), the owner of a public drinking water supply facility classified as a Class A water distribution facility shall ensure that water quality samples are
  - (a) collected from each source of supply, and from at least one site within the distribution system, and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli at least once per quarter each year; and

(b) collected from each source of supply and subjected to a general chemical analysis at least once every three years.

#### 9. (1) Subsection 11(1) of the regulations is amended

- (a) in the words preceding clause (a), by the deletion of the words "where a free chlorine residue of 0.1 milligrams" and the substitution of the words "classified as a Class I, II, III or IV water distribution facility or water treatment facility where a free chlorine residue of 0.2 milligrams";
- (b) in clauses (c) and (d), by the deletion of the words "analyzed for" and the substitution of the words "subjected to"; and
- (c) in clauses (e) and (f), by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (2) Subsection 11(2) of the regulations is amended
  - (a) in the words preceding clause (a), by the deletion of the words "where a free chlorine residue of 0.1 milligrams" and the substitution of the words "classified as a Class I, II, III or IV water distribution facility or water treatment facility where a free chlorine residue of 0.2 milligrams"; and
  - (b) in clauses (c) and (d), by the deletion of the words "analyzed for" and the substitution of the words "subjected to".

#### 10. Section 12 of the regulations is revoked and the following substituted:

12. (1) Where a semi-public drinking water supply system is not Seasonal operation, operated year round, the owner shall ensure that, prior to resuming operations, water quality samples are collected and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli.

semi- public system

(2) Where a public drinking water supply facility classified as a Class B water distribution facility is not operated year round, the owner shall ensure that, prior to resuming operations, water quality samples are collected from each source of supply, and from at least two sites within the distribution system, and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli.

Seasonal operation public supply facility

(3) Where a public drinking water supply facility classified as a Class *Idem* A water distribution facility is not operated year round, the owner shall ensure that, prior to resuming operations, water quality samples are collected from each source of supply, and from at least one site within the distribution system, and analysed for the presence of coliform bacteria and E.coli.

- 11. Subsections 13(2) and (3) of the regulations are amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 12. (1) Subsection 16(1) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (2) Subsection 16(2) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" wherever it occurs and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 13. Clauses 17(1)(c) and (2)(c) of the regulations are amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 14. Subsection 18(2) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 15. (1) Subsection 20(1) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words "to the Department, for the approval of the Minister" and the substitution of the words "to the Minister for approval".
- (2) Subsection 20(2) of the regulations is amended in the words preceding clause (a) and in clauses (b) and (c), by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (3) Clauses 20(3)(a) to (f) of the regulations are amended by the deletion of the word "Department" and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- (4) Subsection 20(8) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Department" wherever it occurs and the substitution of the word "Minister".
- 16. Schedule A of the regulations is amended
  - (a) by the revocation of sections 1 to 7 under the heading "CLASSIFICATION OF FACILITIES" and the substitution of the following:
- 1. (1) A facility shall be classified as one of the following types:
  - (a) water treatment facility (WT);
  - (b) water distribution facility (WD);
  - (c) wastewater treatment facility (WWT);
  - (d) wastewater collection facility (WWC).
- (2) A public drinking water supply facility shall be classified as a water distribution facility unless a chemical other than chlorine is added

to the water supplied, in which case it shall be classified as a water treatment facility.

- (3) A wastewater facility with only collection, lift stations and chlorination shall be classified as a wastewater collection facility.
- (4) A water or wastewater facility with only simple in-line treatment, such as booster pumping, secondary chlorination or odour control, shall not be classified as a water treatment facility or a wastewater treatment facility, as the case may be.
- **2.** (1) Subject to sections 3, 4 and 5, a water distribution facility or wastewater collection facility shall be classified as Class A, B, I, II, III or IV based on the number of service connections the facility has or the size of the population served by the facility, in accordance with Table 1.
- (2) A water treatment facility or wastewater treatment facility shall be classified as Class I, II, III or IV based on the number of points assigned to it under Table 2 or 3, as the case may be.
- **3.** Class A and Class B apply only to public drinking water supply facilities classified as water distribution facilities that are not owned by a municipality.
- **4.** A public drinking water supply facility classified as a water distribution facility that is not owned by a municipality, has more than 150 service connections and supplies a campground, is deemed to be a Class B facility.
- **5.** A public drinking water supply facility classified as a water distribution facility that serves less than 500 persons but does not meet the criteria for Class A or Class B is deemed to be a Class I facility.
- **6.** (1) A facility that was, immediately before the date this subsection comes into force defined as a small public drinking water supply facility is, on the coming into force of this subsection, deemed to be
  - (a) where the facility is not owned by a municipality and has 5 to 20 service connections, a Class A water distribution facility;
  - (b) where the facility is not owned by a municipality and has more than 20 but less than 150 service connections, a Class B water distribution facility;
  - (c) where neither clause (a) nor (b) apply, a Class I water distribution facility.
- (2) A wastewater collection facility that was, immediately before the date this subsection comes into force, defined as a small wastewater collection facility is, on the coming into force of this subsection, deemed to be a Class I wastewater collection facility.

(b) by the revocation of Table 1 and the substitution of the following:

(c) in Table 2, by the deletion of the words "A drinking water supply facility with only chlorination added is considered a distribution system, not a water treatment facility. The addition of any chemical, other than chlorine, to a public drinking water supply facility shall be considered water treatment and the person in direct responsible charge should use this rating worksheet to determine the classification of the facility.";

#### (d) in Table 3,

- (i) by the deletion of the words "A wastewater facility with only collection, lift stations, and chlorination is considered a collection system and not a wastewater treatment facility.",
- (ii) under the heading "Solids handling", by the deletion of the words "facility operator in direct responsible charge" and the substitution of the words "operator-in-charge", and
- (iii) in footnote 2, by the deletion of the words "operator in direct responsible charge" and the substitution of the words "operator-in-charge"; and
- (e) in the definition of "Land application of biosolids by contractor" following Table 3, by the deletion of the words "operator in direct responsible charge" and the substitution of the words "operator-in-charge".

#### 17. Schedule B of the regulations is amended

- (a) in the Table, by the deletion of the words "Small Facility" and the substitution of the words "CLASS B";
- (b) in clause (c), by the deletion of the words "in direct responsible charge (DRC)" and the substitution of the words "direct responsible charge experience";

- (c) in clause (d), by the deletion of the words "in DRC" and the substitution of the words "direct responsible charge experience"; and
- **(d) under the heading "**Operator Educational and Operating Experience Requirements",
  - (i) by the deletion of the subheading "Small Facility" and the substitution of the words "Class B",
  - (ii) under the subheading "Class B",
    - (A) in section 1, by the deletion of the word "small" and the substitution of the words "Class B or higher", and
    - (B) in section 3, by the deletion of the word "small" and the substitution of the words "Class B",
  - (iii) under the subheading "Class III", in section 3, by the addition of the word "experience" after the word "charge".
- 18. Schedule C of the regulations is revoked and Schedule C as set out in the Schedule to these regulations is substituted.
- 19. These regulations come into force on August 8, 2015.

benzene benzo[a]pyrene bromodichloromethane bromoform carbon tetrachloride chloramines chloroform chlorodibromomethane chlorophenols dichloroethylene dichlorobenzenes dichloroethane dichloromethane ethylbenzene monochlorobenzene tetrachloroethylene toluene trichloroethylene vinyl chloride xylenes

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** amends a number of definitions, adds a definition of "operator-in-charge" and repeals definitions of "small public drinking water supply facility" and "small wastewater collection facility", as these terms are no longer used in the Act.

**SECTION 2** replaces a reference to "Department" with "Minister", as it is the Minister who is a legal person able to act. A Department is not a legal person. The section revokes two provisions that repeat requirements in the Act and revokes and replaces another provision with better wording. It adds a provision indicating that a facility classification certificate is valid until it is revoked or replaced by the Minister.

**SECTION 3** revokes and replaces a provision with better wording.

**SECTION 4** requires the designation of an operator-in-charge of a facility. It also replaces references to "operator" with "operator-in-charge" and a reference to "Department" with "Minster".

**SECTION 5** provides exceptions to section 4. It permits the owner of a Class A water distribution facility to designate a person with certain plumbing qualifications as the operator-in-charge of a Class A water distribution facility. It also permits the designation of a person who holds a Class B operator's certificate as the operator-in-charge of a Class I wastewater collection facility that serves less than 250 persons. It also provides a transitional provision under which a person who holds a small facility operator's certificate is deemed to hold a Class B operator's certificate on the coming into force of the section.

<sup>\*</sup> Note: a standard metals scan and volatile organic compounds (VOC) scan offered by most commercial laboratories will normally include the parameters required for a detailed chemical analysis.

**SECTION 6** replaces references to "Department" with "Minister".

**SECTION 7** corrects the title of the Chief Public Health Officer.

**SECTION 8** sets out the drinking water monitoring requirements for semi-public drinking supply systems and Class A and Class B public drinking water supply facilities.

**SECTION 9** clarifies that section 11 of the Act applies to public drinking water supply facilities that are classified as a Class I, II, III or IV water distribution facility or water treatment facility.

**SECTION 10** provides additional monitoring requirements for semipublic drinking supply systems and Class A and Class B public drinking water supply facilities that are not operated year round.

**SECTIONS 11 - 15** replace references to "Department" with "Minister".

**SECTION 16** amends Schedule A of the regulations by revoking and replacing provisions respecting the classification of facilities. It also revokes and replaces Table 1, removes redundant wording in Tables 2 and 3 and replaces references to "operator" with "operator-in-charge".

**SECTION 17** amends Schedule B of the regulations by replacing references to "Small Facility" with "Class B" and to "direct responsible charge" or "DRC" with "direct responsible charge experience" or "DRC experience".

**SECTION 18** revokes and replaces Schedule C of the regulations.

**SECTION 19** provides for the commencement of these regulations.
