

# Budget Highlights



## A Healthier Island

## Shingles Vaccine for Seniors

#### \$1.5 MILLION

Starting in January 2022, the shingles vaccine will be available to all Islanders aged 65 and older.

## Revitalizing Primary Care

#### \$4.4 MILLION

To transform how primary care is delivered in PEI with an emphasis on rural health, seniors care, virtual care and mental health.

## PEI Centre for Mental Well-being

#### \$3 MILLION

This will allow for the establishment of the Centre and a fund for advocacy groups to deliver mental health programming in the Community.

### Diabetes Supports

#### \$1 MILLION

To enhance the Province's Diabetes Strategy, including options for glucose monitoring.

## Recruitment of Nurses and Nurse Practitioners

#### \$1.5MILLION

To establish a multi-year recruitment and retention program to develop, attract, and retain nursing professionals.

#### Virtual Care

#### **\$2.65 MILLION**

Investment to further expand the use of virtual care technologies within our health care system.



## Legacy for our Young Islanders

#### Universal Pre-K

#### \$2.9 MILLION

To support the implementation of a universal half-day program which ensures all children on PEI have access to a quality Pre-K program, beginning September 2021.

## Additional Front Line Staff

#### \$4 MILLION

To provide additional front line staff including 20 teachers, 34 educational assistants, 12 school counsellors, 4 autism consultants, 8 bus drivers and 6 school administrative assistants.

## \$25/day Day Care

#### \$625,000

Effective January 1, 2022 child care rates will be reduced to \$25/day. The annualized cost to fulfill this commitment is \$2.5M.

## More Child Care Spaces

#### \$2 MILLION

To improve access to child care for families, we will designate 8 additional Early Years Centres and this will add 300 new spaces this year.

## Island Advantage Bursary

#### \$500,000

Increases the Island Advantage Bursary, a needs based program, that will assist more Island students in their pursuit of post-secondary education studies.

## Post-Secondary Supports

#### **\$1.28 MILLION**

These funds will support increases to our network of post-secondary partners, including UPEI, AVC, Holland College, and College d'Ile, to better support Island learners.



## A Cleaner Environment

## Energy Efficiency Equipment Program

#### \$5.6 MILLION

To provide extra supports for Islanders to transition from carbon emitting fuel sources.

### Electric Vehicle Rebate

#### \$500,000

A program will be created to provide rebates for electric and plug-in hybrid vehicles.

#### Land Protection Fund

#### \$750,000

To allow organizations to apply for funding to protect land to help PEI meet its land targets.

## Clean Tech Challenge Fund

#### \$250,000

To help Islanders develop and advance ideas to contribute to a clean technology sector in PEI.

## Rural Transit Pilot Program

#### \$250,000

The Province plans to conduct a pilot program to operate a rural transit service.



## An Inclusive and Robust Economy

## Tax Changes

#### \$4.6 MILLION

Includes an increase in the Basic Personal Exemption to \$11,250 and an increase in the Low-Income Reduction Threshold to \$20,000 effective January 1, 2022.

#### Secure Income Pilot

#### \$2.3 MILLION

To extend the Secure Income Pilot that was launched in February 2020 and continue to address poverty in Prince Edward Island.

## Summer Food Program

#### \$600,000

To address food insecurity by extending the School Food Program to be available to students through the summer.

## Tourism Activation Grant Program

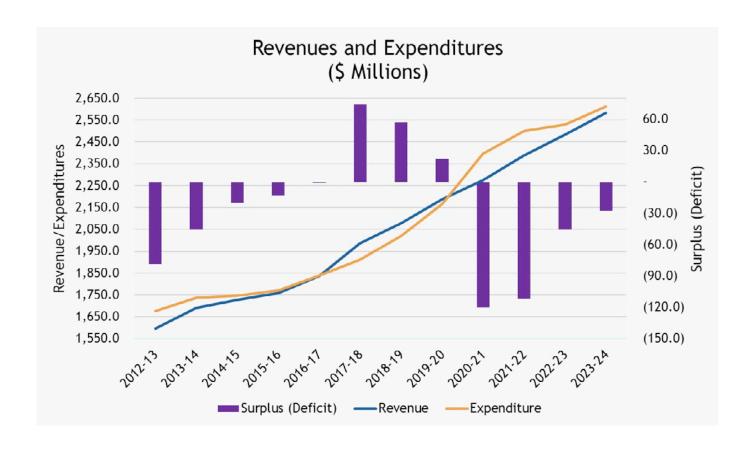
#### \$3 MILLION

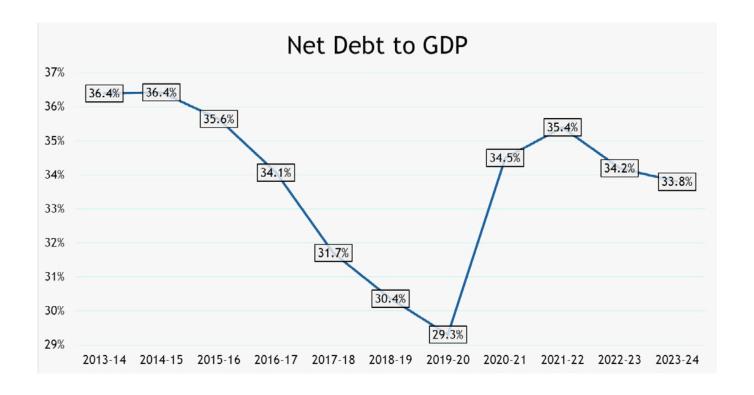
To provide tourism businesses with non-repayable grants to assist with opening costs for the 2021 tourism season.

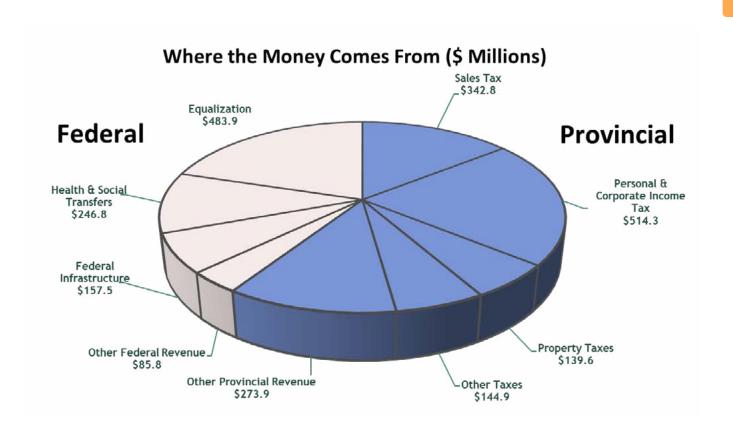
#### Small Business Tax Rate

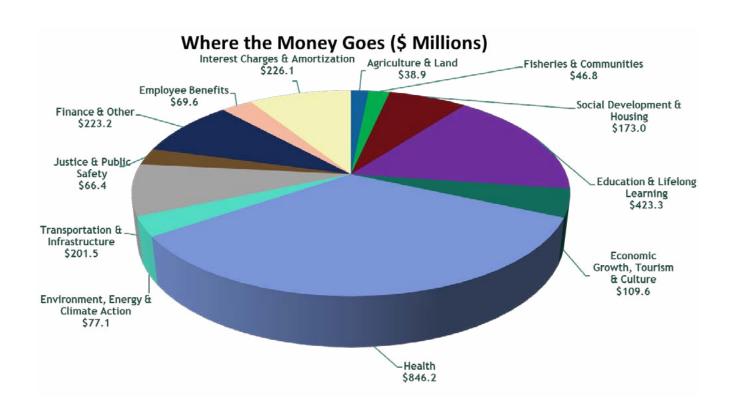
#### \$2.8 MILLION
